

Post Rock Limestone Coalition Board Meeting
March 31, 2021

The April meeting of the Post Rock Limestone Coalition Board of Directors was conducted via Zoom on April 1, 2021. President Brad Penka called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. [Attendees present as per attached list.](#)

The first and most pressing business was dealing with the resignation of Andy Stanton as executive director of the organization. The Board discussed if he should be replaced at this time and, if so, how to accomplish his replacement. This will be work in action.

Brad reported that it was not possible to submit grant applications by the published deadlines. He contacted a number of the groups offering grants and was able to get the deadlines extended.

Brad displayed the Post Rock Limestone brochure that Andy was working on. He said Andy had made good progress with the brochure and now we need to pick it up and move forward. It is 18"x36" with a map on one side and pictures on the other.

On other updates Brad said the Sternberg Museum's "A New Way to Museum: Post Rock" can be accessed via YouTube. [He also reported that he is working to complete the exhibit project by Brynn Wooten, last year's intern, in cooperation with Sternberg Museum as well as the cooperative educational project funded by Golden Belt Community Foundation. Brad also reported that he did a program on the Kansas Humanities Council, "Humanities Hotline" and his \\$100 gratuity will be donated to the Coalition. Christina is working on a mailing for membership.

Jeannie reported on the growing opposition to the Kansas-Nebraska Heritage area. A growing number of people believe is a subtle movement to deprive landowners of the use of their land. There are a number of meetings in the area to organize against the project.

She also reported that the Department of Tourism is being moved to the Department of Commerce.

Under unfinished business attention was drawn to the two vacancies on the Board. There was a brief discussion about current members who might be interested and contacting them to gauge their interest.

The Board voted to accept Andy's resignation as executive director.

Charma Cravens was nominated to serve as the vice-chair of the organization. Her nomination passed.

Brad Penka was nominated to serve another year as the organization's President. His nomination was approved.

Terry Bailey was nominated to serve a second year as the organization's secretary. His nomination was approved.

Jeannie Stramel was nominated to serve another year as the organization's treasurer. Her nomination was approved.

A payment of \$300 to the Grassroots organization for services rendered was approved.

It was decided that the next meeting will be held in La Crosse on Wednesday, May 26, 2021 and will be in-person with Zoom available.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
